B Reasonable Cause for Drug Use

REVISION 13 (07/01/10 -09/30/10)

FAA must determine whether there is reasonable cause to believe the participant engages in the use of <u>illegal drugs(g)</u>.

Reasonable cause exists when one of the following occurs:

- The completed Illegal Drug Use Statement (FAA-1415) or notice (A002) contains one or more YES responses.
- Government or law enforcement documents indicate the use of illegal drugs within the past 30 days by the participant.

Reasonable cause is determined at the following times:

- At new application when benefits are authorized. (See <u>Illegal</u>
 <u>Drug Use Statement at New CA Application Approval</u>) for
 procedures.
- At renewal application when the interview is completed. (See <u>Illegal Drug Use Statement at Renewal Interview</u>) for procedures.
- At new application, FAA Systems Helpdesk staff sends the Illegal Drug Use Statement (A002) notice AFTER the CA benefit is authorized and the approval notice is sent. At renewal application, the participant must complete the Illegal Drug Use Statement (FAA-1415) form or Illegal Drug Use Statement (A002) notice BEFORE the CA benefit is approved.
