.06 Noncitizen Paroled into the U.S.

(07/01/09 – 09/30/09) A parolee is an individual who has been granted lawful temporary residency in the U.S. by USCIS for humanitarian reasons, or the public benefit.

To be potentially eligible for NA or CA, parolee status must meet both of the following:

- Granted for at least one year
- Granted under 212(d)5(A) of the Immigration and Naturalization Act
- NOTE This does not apply to parolees from Cuba or Haiti. (See <u>Cuban or Haitian Entrant</u>)

A parolee who has been granted Lawful Permanent Resident (LPR) status is potentially eligible for NA or CA. (For CA, see <u>Continuous</u> <u>Residency</u>)
