10 NA Able Bodied Adult Without Dependents – Overview

REVISION 42 (06/01/16 - 07/31/16)

Consider an able-bodied adult without dependents as an ABAWD participant. The ABAWD certification must not exceed three months unless that person is meeting the <u>ABAWD work requirements</u> or an ABAWD exemption.

NOTE When a participant has a minor dependent child, do not consider the participant as an ABAWD. See <u>Residing With a Minor Child</u>

Participants must comply with ABAWD work requirements or meet an ABAWD work registration exemption in order to continue receiving NA.

The three-month time limit does not apply to individuals who meet the following criteria:

- under 18 years of age
- 50 years of age or over
- physically or mentally unfit for employment
- responsible for a dependent child
- residing in a household where a household member is under age 18
- pregnant
- chronically homeless
- victim of domestic violence
- receipt of SSI
- care for an incapacitated person
- participation in a drug or rehabilitation program
 - student
 - applicant or recipient of Unemployment Insurance
- participant in other work program
- receiving Transitional Benefit Assistance
- migrant or seasonal farm worker

All other NA participants are considered ABAWDs.
