- Certificate of Naturalization (N-550 or N-570).
- Certificate of U.S. Citizenship (N-560 or N-561).
- Report of Birth Abroad of a U.S. Citizen (FS-240) issued by the U.S. State Department.
 - U.S. Consular officers statement.
 - A United States Citizen Identification Card (I-197).
 - Northern Mariana Identification Card (I-873).
 - American Indian Card (I-872) issued by USCIS with the classification code KIC.
