.03 Refugee or Amerasian

A refugee or Amerasian is admitted into the U.S. under Section 207 of INA.

This noncitizen is potentially eligible for benefits for a period of seven years from the date that their status is granted.

MA EXCEPTION

The seven year period does not apply. There is no maximum time limit.

Applicants are potentially eligible for benefits regardless of any later change in their status. (See <u>LPR Eligibility</u>)

These applicants normally have one of the following USCIS documents:

- <u>I-94</u> endorsed to show entry as a refugee under Section 207 of the INA or entry as an Amerasian.
- <u>I-688B</u> with a provision of law code 274a.12(a)(3).
- <u>I-766</u> with A3.
- USCIS Refugee Travel Document (I-571) showing admission as a refugee.
- An USCIS letter granting admission as an Amerasian.
