.01 Adding Formerly Nonqualified Noncitizens to Active Case

A nonqualified noncitizen's status may change to a <u>qualified</u> <u>noncitizen</u>. This may be due to any of the following reasons:

- A change in noncitizen USCIS status. To add the noncitizen to the case, the budgetary unit must report and verify the noncitizen's change in status. (See <u>Declaration of Citizenship</u> <u>Status</u> and <u>Verification of Noncitizen Status</u>)
- The noncitizen may become a citizen. (See <u>Verification of U.S.</u> <u>Citizenship</u> Status)
- The nonqualified noncitizen may now have 40 qualifying quarters. (See <u>Accumulating 40 Quarters</u> and <u>Approval</u> <u>Pending 40 Quarters Verification</u>)

For procedures to add participants to a budgetary unit, see <u>Adding</u> Participants.

Verify noncitizen status at the interview or prior to approval. Complete this through the <u>Verification Information System</u> (VIS). VIS does not apply to applicants with newly acquired U.S. citizenship.
