B NA Special Consideration of Income

Disqualified participants are not included when determining the budgetary unit size or when assigning a benefit level. The income of the disqualified participant is counted in full or prorated to the remaining participants in the budgetary unit, depending on the disqualification reason.

A participant who meets one of the following criteria is considered disqualified and has their income counted in full:

- NA E&T disqualification noncompliance (key DE in the PT field on SEPA).
- <u>Intentional Program Violation</u> (key DF in the PT field on SEPA).
- NA Fleeing Felon (key DF in the PT field on SEPA).
- <u>Felony drug conviction</u> (key DF in the PT field on SEPA).
- A conviction for any of the following (key DF in the PT field on SEPA):

Trading NA for controlled substances.

Trading controlled substances for NA.

Trafficking NA benefits.

Making fraudulent statements concerning identity or residence in order to receive multiple NA benefits.

<u>Voluntary job quit</u> - reduction in work effort (key DE in the PT field on SEPA).

A participant who meets one of the following criteria is considered disqualified and has their income prorated to the budgetary unit participants:

 Noncompliance with the <u>SSN enumeration requirements</u> (key DI in the PT field on SEPA). Not meeting <u>able-bodied work requirements</u> after receiving three months of benefits in a 36-month period (key DI in the PT field on SEPA).

Nonqualified noncitizen (key DI in the PT field on SEPA).
