06 CA Needy Family Test

REVISION 25 (07/01/13 – 09/30/13)

The CA Needy Family Test is used to determine whether the dependent child resides in a needy family. The test is based on the earned and unearned income of the <u>family(g)</u> of the <u>caretaker relative(g)</u>. All members of the caretaker relative's family must be registered to the AZTECS case so that AZTECS can perform the CA Needy Family Test.

EXCEPTION

The CA Needy Family Test does not apply to the following:

- Kinship Foster Care when the child is in the legal custody of the Department of Child Safety (DCS).
- The following Tribal TANF programs:

Hopi Tribal TANF

Navajo Nation Program for Self Reliance

Pascua Yaqui Tribal TANF

Salt River Tribal TANF

White Mountain Apache Tribal TANF

The family size of the caretaker relative is used for the CA Needy Family Test; however, the budgetary unit size is used to determine the CA grant amount. See the following examples to assist in understanding the difference between family sizes and budgetary unit sizes:

When the adult caretaker is a non-parent specified relative of the dependent child and they are applying for the child only, then the family's combined income cannot exceed <u>130% of the current Federal Poverty Level</u>.

When the caretaker relative is a parent of the dependent child or the nonparent specified relative is applying for themselves and the child, then the family's combined income cannot exceed <u>100% of the current Federal</u> <u>Poverty Level</u>.
