## A Basic Categorical Eligibility

REVISION 01 (07/01/07 - 09/30/07)

Basic categorical eligibility exists for an NA budgetary unit when any of the following apply:

 Any participant in the budgetary unit receives, or is authorized to receive, any of the following benefits:

TANF CA Benefits. This includes when either of the following occur:

- The budgetary unit is CA eligible, but no CA benefit is being paid.
- Any portion of the CA benefit is being recouped for an overpayment.

(See Examples CE TANF 1-7)

TANF Services. (See TANF benefits or services(g))

**Grant Diversion.** 

CA Kinship Foster Care.

NN-TANE.

Refugee Cash Assistance (RCA).

 ALL participants in a budgetary unit receive, or are authorized to receive, any of the following:

GA or BIA GA (See BIA Payments)

SSI

A combination of GA or BIA GA and SSI

(See Example CE GA or SSI 1 and Example CE GA or SSI 2)

This includes participants whose SSI benefits are in <u>no-pay(g)</u> or <u>suspend status(g)</u>.

## **EXCEPTION**

This does not include SSI participants that are in suspend status for failure to comply with a drug and alcohol treatment requirement.

NOTE When any participant in the budgetary unit meets the NA definition of elderly or disabled, the budgetary unit receives special considerations. (See Elderly or Disabled NA Requirements)

(See Exceptions to NA Categorical Eligibility)

Consider an NA Basic categorically eligible budgetary unit to have met the following NA eligibility factors:

- Resources.
- Gross and net income tests.
- Sponsored noncitizen information.
- Residency.
- <u>Social Security numbers</u> for CA and GA participants, and SSI recipients.
