A Basic Categorical Eligibility

REVISION 09 (07/01/09 – 09/30/09)

Basic categorical eligibility exists for an NA budgetary unit when any of the following apply:

• Any participant in the budgetary unit receives, or is authorized to receive, any of the following benefits:

TANF CA Benefits. This includes when either of the following occur:

- The budgetary unit is CA eligible, but no CA benefit is being paid.
- Any portion of the CA benefit is being recouped for an overpayment.

(See Examples <u>CE TANF 1-7</u>)

TANF Services. (See TANF benefits or services(g))

Grant Diversion.

CA Kinship Foster Care.

The Navajo Nation Program for Self Reliance.

Refugee Cash Assistance (RCA).

ALL participants in a budgetary unit receive, or are authorized to receive, any of the following:

BIA GA

SSI

A combination of BIA GA and SSI

(See Examples <u>CE GA or SSI 1</u> and <u>CE GA or SSI 2</u>) This includes participants whose SSI benefits are in <u>no-pay(g)</u> or <u>suspend status(g)</u>.

EXCEPTION

This does not include SSI participants that are in suspended status for failure to comply with a drug and alcohol treatment requirement.

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NOTE When any participant in the budgetary unit meets the NA definition of elderly or disabled, the budgetary unit receives <u>special considerations</u>. (See <u>Elderly or Disabled NA</u> <u>Requirements</u>)

(See Exceptions to NA Categorical Eligibility)

Consider an NA Basic categorically eligible budgetary unit to have met the following NA eligibility factors:

- <u>Resources</u>.
- <u>Gross</u> and <u>net</u> income tests.
- Sponsored noncitizen information.
- <u>Residency</u>.
- <u>Social Security numbers</u> for CA and BIA GA participants, and SSI recipients.
