.09 Sanctions - Hopi Tribal TANF

REVISION 16 (04/01/11 – 06/30/11)

When a participant fails to comply with any of the Hopi Tribal TANF Program PRA requirements specified in their policy, it may be necessary to sanction the TANF CA case.

When an adult participant does not comply with the following Hopi TANF Program requirements, a sanction is imposed:

- Ensures all school age children attend school.
- Ensures all school age children's immunizations are up to date.
- Complies with all employment requirements.

The Hopi TANF Program policy mirrors the state CA progressive sanction policy. (See <u>CA PRA Progressive Sanctions</u> and <u>CA Ongoing Sanction SAR Report</u>)

When a Hopi TANF participant case is closed due to the first 100% sanction, the budgetary unit is not eligible for three months following the 100% sanction month.

When a Hopi TANF participant applies for Hopi TANF within three months following the 100% closure month, deny the Hopi TANF application using the NH Denial or Closure Reason Code. Send the A602 notice.

When another sanction is imposed after the first 100% sanction, the budgetary unit is not eligible for six months.

When a Hopi TANF participant applies again within the six months following a second 100% sanction, deny the application using the HT Denial Closure Reason Code. Send the A611 notice.

(See CA Initial Month Special Rules)

NOTE When a Hopi TANF CA case closes due to a 100% sanction and the participant reapplies in a non Hopi service delivery area and meets all FAA CA eligibility criteria, approve the case. ALL prior sanctions keyed in AZTECS count.
