.08 Sanctions – San Carlos Apache Tribe TANF

REVISION 38 (10/01/15 - 11/30/15)

When a participant fails to comply with any of the San Carlos Apache Tribe (SCAT) TANF Program PRA requirements specified in their policy, it may be necessary to sanction the Tribal TANF case.

A sanction is imposed when an adult participant does not comply with the following San Carlos Apache Tribe TANF Program requirements:

- All children between the ages of 6 through 18 must be enrolled and attending school.
- All children must be immunized.
- Compliance with the Jobs Program.

For the first and second instance of noncompliance, the SCAT TANF Program policy mirrors the state CA progressive sanction policy. (See <u>CA PRA Progressive Sanctions</u> and <u>CA Ongoing Sanction SAR</u> <u>Report</u>)

For the third instance of noncompliance, the SCAT TANF participant's case is closed due to a 100% sanction, and the budgetary unit is not eligible for five months following the 100% sanction month.

When a SCAT TANF participant applies for SCAT TANF within five months following the 100% closure month, deny the SCAT TANF application using the SD Denial or Closure Reason Code. Send the <u>A646</u> notice. (See <u>CA Initial Month Special Rules</u>)

NOTE

When a SCAT Tribal TANF case closes due to a 100% sanction and the participant reapplies in a non San Carlos service delivery area and meets all state CA eligibility criteria, approve the case. ALL prior sanctions keyed in AZTECS count.
