Change: Dependents of a Foster Care Participant

EFFECTIVE DATE: For all eligibility determinations completed on or after 10/01/2024

Dependent children of a foster care participant residing in a foster care facility are potentially eligible for NA.

A foster care participant residing in a foster care facility contracted with the Department of Child Services (DCS), who is receiving most of their meals (over 50% of three meals daily) from the facility, is not eligible for NA. However, when the foster care participant's dependent children, who are not foster care participants, reside with them and are not provided meals by the facility, the dependent children are potentially eligible for NA.

When a foster care participant is applying for a dependent child and verification of residency and less than 50% of three daily meals for the dependent child is provided, complete *all* of the following:

- Key the DE Participation Code in the PT field on SEPA next to the Primary Informant (PI).
- Key the RI Ineligible Reason Code in the INELIG RSN field and the date of ineligibility in the DATE field on SEPA, when applicable.

The NA PI may be keyed DE on SEPA and the case can remain open when **one** of the following applies:

- There is another adult budgetary unit participant designated as the NA Lead Participant.
- The PI is a foster care participant, residing in a foster care facility with a dependent child who is not a foster care participant.

PRAP is not required to be keyed when the PI is keyed with the DE Participation Code on SEPA due to being a foster care participant receiving the majority of meals from a foster care facility.

Updated NA only disqualifications to include when the primary informant (PI) is a foster care participant residing in a facility that is providing the majority of meals (over 50% of three meals daily) for the foster care PI but not for the PI's dependents. The dependents of the PI are potentially NA eligible, and the PI is not. (Effective with all eligibility determinations completed on or after 10/01/2024)

Change: Compact of Free Association (COFA)

EFFECTIVE DATE: For all eligibility determinations completed on or after 09/30/2024

On 03/09/2024, the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2024 was signed into law.

The change in law provides that the Compact of Free Association (COFA) citizens of all the following countries who lawfully reside in the U.S. are potentially eligible for NA and CA:

- The Federated States of Micronesia
- The Republic of the Marshall Islands
- The Republic of Palau

COFA citizens living in the United States are required to establish lawful residency. However, COFA citizens are not required to meet additional noncitizen requirements to be potentially eligible for NA and CA.

Change: ABAWD Age Exemption Change

EFFECTIVE DATE: For all eligibility determinations completed on or after 10/01/2024

The age exemption for Able Bodied Adult Without Dependents (ABAWD) has been increased to 55 years of age as a result of the Fiscal Responsibility Act (FRA) of 2023.

An NA participant, 18 through 54 years of age, with no dependents, who is physically and mentally fit for employment, meets the definition of ABAWD.

When a participant returns a completed Newborn Information for CA/NA (X113) notice, upload the notice into OnBase using the Deemed Newborn Information document type.

When the X113 is uploaded into OnBase using the Deemed Newborn Information document type, the Deemed Newborn Information ACTS Alert is created to be sure the newborn is added to the NA and CA benefits.

General Information: Replacement Issuance of Stolen NA and CA Benefits is Ending

On 12/29/2022, a federal law was passed to protect and replace NA benefits stolen from 10/01/2022 through 09/30/2024. The Administration of Children and Families (ACF) aligned CA with the federal law allowing the replacement of CA benefits stolen electronically.

The federal law only allows States to replace benefits stolen on or before 09/30/2024. Benefits are potentially eligible for replacement provided they are reported within 45 calendar days of the theft.

Example: The participant has until 11/14/2024 to have benefits potentially replaced that were stolen on 09/30/2024.
