.01 LIBL Hardship Extension Eligibility – Disability Verfication

REVISION 03 (01/01/08 – 03/31/08)

Verification must be provided, to support the LIBL hardship extension request, based on disability, to be eligible for an LIBL hardship extension.

Verification of medical disabilities includes, but is not limited to, any of the following:

- Completed Medical Statement (FA-196) form or other signed statement from a treatment provider(g)
- Disability verification from the Veteran's Administration (VA)
- Vocational Rehabilitation documents, examinations or evaluations signed by a treatment provider
- The District Medical Consultant (DMC) determination
- Deferral from Jobs based on disability
 - NOTE Contact the Employment Administration Policy and Training Section via e-mail, to verify that the participant was deferred from participation in Jobs, the number of months of deferral, and the reason.

The verification must include ALL of the following information:

- That the participant's medical condition prevents the participant from working or engaging in work activities
- The duration of the disability
- A prognosis of recovery
- The date re-examination or re-evaluation is scheduled for or is recommended
- A treatment provider's or physician's signature

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• For a disabled child, both of the following are required:

A statement from a treatment provider indicating the participant is needed as a caretaker

A statement from the caregiver indicating all of the following:

- That they care for the disabled child
- The number of hours of <u>respite care(g)</u> that they receive per week
- The number of hours per week that the child attends school or a vocational rehabilitation program
- NOTE For a Jobs deferral based on disability, no other verification is necessary other than verification of deferral.

The verification used must be documented either in the <u>case file(g)</u> or on CADO.
