Change: Federally Subsidized Housing for the Elderly

EFFECTIVE DATE: For applications received on or after 03/22/2021

A policy reference has been created to define Federally Subsidized Housing for the Elderly to ensure staff are screening NA applicants who reside in this type of institution correctly.

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development provides monies to private, nonprofit facilities to finance the development of supportive housing for the elderly under the Section 202 Program. Participants who reside in such facilities are not considered residents of an institution.

Prior to approving a participant who resides in a federally subsidized facility for the elderly, FAA staff must ensure the facility is listed on the PST Institutions List. The Policy Support Team determines when the facility meets the qualification requirements to be listed.

Change: Minors Receiving UI Income

EFFECTIVE DATE: For applications received on or after 03/22/2021

This change was made to clarify that participants under the age of 18 years (minors) may be eligible for Unemployment Insurance (UI) benefits as long as they meet the eligibility criteria in federal law

There is no age limit to apply for UI benefits. UI eligibility is determined on a case by case basis. When minors are not eligible for regular UI income, they may apply for Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA).

Unemployment compensation payments, except Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC) payments, are countable as unearned income when received by participants under the age of 18.

Reminder: List All Household Members on HEAplus Applications

This is a reminder that FAA staff must include everyone residing in the household on the "Household Members" page in HEAplus. Failure to do so may result in incorrect information being reported. During the interview, it is the responsibility of the Eligibility Interviewer to determine which participants should be included in the budgetary unit. Failure to list all household members may cause a mandatory participant to be excluded, causing incorrect benefits to be issued to the budgetary unit.

HEAplus functionality has been corrected to resolve known issues in this process. Any HEAplus or AZTECS systems issues should be elevated to the FAA Systems Help Desk for review. Staff must not attempt to bypass this requirement due to systems issues.

Reminder: Extension of UI Benefits and Stimulus Payment

An <u>Urgent Bulletin</u> was emailed on 03/19/2021 to inform staff that the President signed the H.R.1319 - American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021 on 03/11/2021 that authorizes an extension of supplemental unemployment benefits created by the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security ("CARES") Act. This authorization allows expansion of the following Unemployment Insurance (UI) benefits:

Pandemic Unemployment Assistance (PUA):

PUA provides benefits to self-employed participants, contract workers, and other workers who are not eligible for regular unemployment benefits.

Participants are allowed to receive up to 79 weeks of PUA benefits until the benefit week ending 09/04/2021. The hub verification for PUA income is available in HEAplus effective 08/11/2020 and is acceptable verification for Nutrition Assistance (NA) and Cash Assistance (CA).

PUA is countable for NA and Refugee Cash Assistance (RCA) and not countable for CA.

Key the following on UNIC in the month it is received using the WK frequency code:

- For NA and CA, key the UI PU Unearned Income Code.
- For RCA, key the UI OT Unearned Income Code.

Pandemic Emergency Unemployment Compensation (PEUC):

PEUC is a pandemic extension that provides an additional unemployment benefit to qualified participants whose regular state or federal unemployment benefits were exhausted on or after July 1, 2019.

Participants are allowed to receive up to 53 weeks of PEUC benefits until the benefit week ending 09/04/2021. It is verified through HOSC and appears under the UI AMT field. PUA recipients do not qualify for PEUC benefits.

PEUC is countable for NA and RCA and not countable for CA.

Key the following on UNIC in the month it is received using the WK frequency code:

- For NA and CA, key the UI Unearned Income Code.
- For RCA, key the UI OT Unearned Income Code.

Federal Pandemic Unemployment Compensation (FPUC):

FPUC is an additional \$300 weekly benefit for participants when they receive at least one dollar of underlying benefits for a claimed week.

Participants are allowed to receive the \$300 weekly benefit on top of their underlying unemployment

benefit until the benefit week ending 09/04/2021.

The FPUC payment is excluded as income in the month of receipt and as a resource in any of the nine months following receipt for NA and CA.

FPUC is countable for RCA as income.

Key the following on UNIC in the month it is received using the WK frequency code:

- For NA and CA, key the UI FP Unearned Income Code.
- For RCA, key the UI OT Unearned Income Code.

Third Stimulus Payment:

The H.R.1319, American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) of 2021 included a provision for additional 2021 Recovery Rebates for Individuals. This provision authorizes up to an additional \$1400 payment to eligible participants, including children. This payment is also known as a Stimulus Payment.

The Stimulus Payment is being treated as a Federal Tax Refund for 2021. This payment is not countable as income or a resource in the month of receipt and the 12 months after the month of receipt for NA or CA.

Key the TR Unearned Income Code in the INC TYPE field on UNIC in the month the income is received. Key OX on the LIAS AZTECS screen for any money remaining in the following 12 months as a resource.

General Information: P-EBT Issuance has Started

The first payment for Pandemic EBT (P-EBT) of school year 2020/2021 was issued on 03/18/2021. The NA household received either a full or partial Child Care P-EBT payment for each child under six receiving NA for the month of October 2020. The payment amount is based on the learning plan of the schools in the county they live. For more information about Child Care P-EBT, see des.az.gov/child-care-p-ebt.

How to Search for P-EBT cases in AZTECS?

P-EBT K-12 payments are added to open NA/CA cases, 2020 P-EBT cases, or new P-EBT cases created for the 2020/2021 school year.

The information for P-EBT cases was provided by Arizona's Department of Education (ADE). To locate the P-EBT customer in AZTECS, use the child's name, date of birth, or any available information the guardian/parent provides.

A Social Security Number (SSN) search may not be productive because SSNs were not provided with each child on the ADE list.
