EFFECTIVE DATE: The CNAP Manual has been updated as of 08/28/2023

Site Code 466C is used in AZTECS to identify cases located in Colorado City, AZ, due to special processing needs.

Do not change the SITE CODE field on CARC when the case is assigned to Site Code 466C. Site Code 466C has been added to the list of specialty caseloads.

Change: Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2023

EFFECTIVE DATE: For all applications received on or after 09/01/2023
The Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2023 requires changes to the Able Bodied Adults Without Dependents (ABAWD) policy.

FAA has an approved ABAWD waiver through 09/30/2023 that suspends the ABAWD time limit. Though the ABAWD time limit is waived, FAA staff must follow the policy and AZTECS keying procedures for reporting purposes.

Starting 09/01/2023, all of the following changes have been made to the ABAWD policy:

- FAA staff must screen all NA participants 18 years of age through 50 years of age to determine whether the participant is subject to the ABAWD work requirements.
- New ABAWD exemptions have been added for **all** the following participants:

Participants experiencing homelessness.

Veterans who served in the United States Armed Forces, regardless of the discharge or release status.

Former foster care youth 24 years of age or younger who were in the custody of foster care when they turned age 18, or a higher age when the maximum age for foster care is higher than 18.

All of the following ABAWD exemptions have changed:

The ABAWD age exemption is changing from 50 years of age or older to 51 years of age or older.

The mentally or physically unfit for work exemption will no longer be used for homeless participants. FAA staff should use the new ABAWD exemption for homelessness.

 All ABAWD exemptions can be verified using participant statement verification, unless questionable.

When a participant claims an ABAWD exemption that is questionable, the participant has the primary responsibility for providing verification of the exemption. Examples of verification that can be used for ABAWD exemptions have been added to the CNAP Manual.

More changes are being made to the ABAWD policy and procedures to prepare for the ABAWD statewide time limit waiver ending on 09/30/2023. The Policy Support Team (PST) will be notifying FAA staff and NA participants of these changes soon.

Clarification: Mid Approval Contact (MAC) Unity Form

Clarification has been added to the CNAP Manual on the use of the Mid Approval Review Unity Form to complete the MAC process.

Staff can use the Mid Approval Review Unity Form to assist the participant with responding to the MAC questions. Also, the Nutrition Assistance (NA) Mid Approval Contact (FAA-1108A) form is only used for in-person contact and when the unity form is not available.

For more information on how participants can complete the MAC process, see <u>FAA6.A02A.01</u> titled NA 12-Month or 24-Month Approval MAC Requirement and <u>FAA6.A02A.02</u> titled NA 36-Month Approval Period MAC Requirement.

Clarification: NA Work Requirement Notice Procedures

The CNAP+ Manual procedures have been updated. It was discovered that the NA Work Requirements (X640) notice was not being automatically mailed. The notice is required to be sent to the budgetary unit when at least one participant is subject to NA work requirements. The notice is sent automatically when NA benefits are approved at initial, renewal, or when a change is made causing a participant to become non-exempt. The issue has been resolved.

When it is discovered that the budgetary unit did not receive the X640 notice, FAA staff must send the NA Work Requirements (F040) notice.

The F040 and X640 notices are used to explain the NA work requirements when the budgetary unit has at least one participant subject to NA work requirements.
