A Conflict of Interest - Employee/Contractor Reporting Responsibility

REVISION 19 (01/01/12 - 03/31/12)

All employees and contractors must report all cases with a conflict of interest to their supervisor or local office manager (LOM).

Management will determine whether there is a conflict of interest. When a conflict of interest is determined, the case information must be documented on the Conflict of Interest Case Information (FAA-1447A) form.

All employees and contractors must complete a Conflict of Interest/Confidentiality Statement (FAA-1446A) form at least once per year. Case information for all cases that have a conflict of interest must be listed on the Conflict of Interest Case Information (FAA-1447A) form. Multiple FAA-1447A forms may be needed.

WARNING

Do not view case information to complete these forms. When needed, the supervisor must complete any necessary research to provide the AZTECS case numbers.

NOTE When an employee states that they do not know of any cases with a conflict of interest, the employee must complete the appropriate section of an FAA-1446A form.

When it is learned that there is an additional case that has a conflict of interest, the employee must complete and submit a FAA-1447A form to their supervisor immediately upon learning of the new conflict.

The local office must retain and forward a copy of the completed forms. (See Conflict of Interest – Local Office Reporting Responsibility for additional instructions.)

WARNING

All AZTECS and OnBase(g) inquiries are recorded. Actions that display on a case in which there may be a conflict of interest could be considered suspicious or potentially fraudulent activity.

Employees must immediately report any accidental viewing of case information to a case that has a conflict of interest to their supervisor. The supervisor must record this information in the employee's file.

When management suspects a potential violation has occurred, the situation will be elevated to upper management for investigation.
