O Sanctions - WMAT

REVISION 10 (10/01/09 – 12/31/09)

When a participant fails to comply with any of the White Mountain Apache Tribe (WMAT) TANF Program requirements, it may be necessary to sanction the TANF case.

Progressive sanctions consist of a series of benefit reductions. The progressive sanction may or may not be consecutive in months. A 100% benefit reduction sanction results in case closure.

Progressive sanctions are <u>cumulative</u> for all participants and all PRA program requirements.

Each sanction that is imposed must last a minimum of one month.

The three levels of sanctions are as follows:

- For the FIRST instance of noncompliance, AZTECS reduces the total cash benefit by 25%.
- For the SECOND instance of noncompliance, AZTECS reduces the total cash benefit by 50%.
- For the THIRD instance of noncompliance AZTECS stops benefits.

When an adult participant does not comply with the following WMAT-TANF Program requirements, impose a sanction:

- All children age 6 through 18 must attend school.
 FAA determines when WMAT-TANF participants are not in compliance with this requirement. FAA imposes the sanction and sends the WMAT sanction notice.
- All school age children's immunizations must be current.
 FAA determines when WMAT-TANF participants are not in compliance with this requirement. FAA imposes the sanction and sends the WMAT sanction notice.
- All mandatory WMAT Jobs Program participants must comply with work registration requirements.

Employment sanction communications between FAA and WMAT-TANF staff are completed using the <u>Tribal-Turn Around Document (TAD)</u> (FAA-1125A) form. FAA imposes the sanction and sends the sanction notice.

The WMAT-TANF Program policy follows the state CA progressive sanction policy. (See <u>CA PRA Progressive Sanctions</u> and <u>CA Ongoing Sanction SAR Report</u>)

When a WMAT-TANF participant is noncompliant and the case is closed due to a 100% sanction, the participant is not eligible for three months following the 100% sanction month.

When a WMAT-TANF participant applies for WMAT-TANF within three months following the 100% sanction month, complete the following:

- When the application cannot be prorated, deny the WMAT-TANF application using the WE Denial or Closure Reason Code.
- Send the <u>A765 notice</u>

When a WMAT-TANF case closes due to a 100% sanction and the participant reapplies in a non-WMAT service delivery area and meets all CA eligibility criteria, approve the case. ALL prior sanctions keyed in AZTECS count. This includes tribal TANF program sanctions.
